I. HRTM Students Spent Spring Break in Italy

East Stroudsburg University students studying Hospitality, Recreation, and Tourism Management (HRTM) had the opportunity to study abroad in Italy for nine days earlier this semester. The students explored the Tuscany region, where they learned about viticulture and winemaking. They visited three renowned vineyards: Poggio Alloro in San Gimignano, Ruffino in Chianti, and Tenute Silvio Nardi in Montalcino. Each winery hosted a guided vineyard tour providing students with an in-depth understanding of how wines are produced in Italy.

The group also visited Rome, where they had the chance to explore the Vatican Museum, Sistine Chapel, and St. Peter's Basilica. They also visited the Roman Forum and the Colosseum, experiencing the rich history and culture of Italy. "This trip was an incredible opportunity for our students to learn about Italian wine production and explore the historical and cultural landmarks of Rome. We are proud to offer this unique study abroad experience that goes beyond sightseeing," said Dr. Chiang. "The trip transformed ESU students into more well-rounded global citizens by fostering personal growth, honing communication skills in an immersive environment, and broadened cultural perspectives while giving them a deeper look into the industry."



II. HRTM Best Poster Award at Conference

East Stroudsburg University student Gianna DiLauro, a senior studying hospitality, recreation, and tourism management (HRTM) from Stroudsburg, Pa., and Fredrick "Chuck" Meitner, Ph.D., assistant professor of HRTM, attended the 2024 International Hotel, Restaurant, and Institutional Education (ICHRIE) Northeast North America Federation Conference at the University of Southern Maine.

At the conference, DiLauro received the Best Poster Award for research she did, with Dr. Meitner, exploring the nuanced dynamics between psychological ownership and attachment theory and loyalty within private clubs. "Gianna's accomplishment defies convention as poster presentations of this caliber are typically associated with graduate students," Dr. Sylvester Williams, Dean of ESU's College of Business and Management said. "This accolade not only underscores Gianna's exceptional talent but also highlights the pivotal role played by the ESU Summer Undergraduate Research Experience (S.U.R.E.) grant in supporting her endeavors."

Awarded in 2023, the S.U.R.E. grant facilitated DiLauro's research journey, empowering her with resources to delve deep into data analytics techniques, including R programming.

V. Stony Acres Challenge Course







Stony Acres Challenge Course Level 1 Badge: Teambuilding on Low Elements and Basic Belaying is designed and offered for hospitality, recreation, and tourism majors. This two-day training session introduces a variety of warm-up, trust, and group problem-solving activities through low ropes courses. participants will be able to gain the following competencies and a Credly badge after completed and passed the challenge.

- Define and explain basic concepts of working with groups from different demographics in a ropes course setting
- Facilitate warm-up, trust, and group problem-solving activities
- Demonstrating spotting and participant safety skills
- Lead processing/reflecting discussions during activities

In addition to the above basic components, after participants have successfully completed the course, they will be able to distinguish the basic concepts of static and dynamic belays and demonstrate proper climbing communication protocols and basic belaying.

VI. Alumni Networking and Career Expo

The Hospitality, Recreation, and Tourism Management Department of East Stroudsburg University organized the Alumni Networking and Career Expo Event. 




X. Eta Sigma Delta Hospitality Honor Society: ESU Chapter




XI. Internship Spotlight Jessica


